At the recent AGM I announced the charity for the coming year and that is Prostate Cancer UK. The charity is chosen from suggestions put forward by committee members and natter leaders and then voted on by the same. This charity was the unanimous winner in both the first and second votes. Prostate Cancer UK has a simple ambition – to stop men dying from prostate cancer. Through shifting the science over the next 10 years to focus on radical improvements in diagnosis, treatment, prevention, and support, they hope to stop prostate cancer being a killer.

The Cavalcade was raising money through sales of its rally plates and other donations as it travelled the country in aid of Lupus UK and Dementia UK. The South East added to its total at the event but there was also another bonus. We had some fantastic sponsors for the event and once all the figures were tallied up and the debts paid-off we found there was a surplus. That was split between the South East Centre and the MG Owners Club. Our portion was donated to the Centre's charity, Prostate Cancer UK, which took our yearly total to over £2000. It's a brilliant achievement but sets a very high bar for next year! There are still some collections to come – the rattle tin hasn't been opened yet, there will be a raffle at the annual lunch and the natters, no doubt, also have some fundraising cash to donate. 2024 Carbon Balancing Scheme

New Carbon Capture Scheme for 2024 to help save the Planet!



The Centre has decided for all key events, to arrange a Carbon Balancing Scheme for our cars which means we will be balancing our emissions! We will be working in partnership with the FBHVC and Tree-v our partners to deliver this for the Centre.

So, what is Carbon Capture?

This is all about the future, By Carbon capturing your emissions you are investing in creating new woodland here in the UK. The new trees will gradually over the lifetime of the project, remove a certified amount of C02 from the Atmosphere.

So how does it work for us?

We will be adding a 50p contribution to entry forms to create a fund to submit to tree-v to deliver the trees. As an example, last year's Autumn Penshurst event created from the run distances and approximate mileage to the start of all participants about a 972kgs of C02. If we had charged 50p to the 100 participants we would have raised £50 towards balancing our emissions; carbon capturing would have cost this amount. Sustainability is also about our waste created at events, this includes excessive paperwork and a move to more environmentally friendly ways and the use of more online and administrative functions of the Centre. "

Other Advantages

Driving classic cars is sometimes frowned upon, we have all seen it.

Some event locations that the Committee try to engage with are progressively 'going green' so we don't necessarily fit in with that ethos. Hopefully by doing this we answer some of those concerns both for us as drivers and as we negotiate venues in the future. <u>Why Tree-V</u>

Tree-v are an automotive focussed offsetting company set up by classic car enthusiasts. Their moto is "preserve the past, preserve the future" They partner with Forest Carbon who have already planted over 13 million trees and are certified by the Woodland Carbon Code. Key to this is planting the right trees in the right place. Will Opie

AUTUMN 'TASTER' NAVISCAT – Sunday 6th October 2024

Come and join us at the Coblands Garden Centre Café at 10.0am on the A25 just West of Sevenoaks for our annual Autumn Naviscat rally!

You don't have to be a member of the MGCC or a Motorsport UK affiliated club to enter this!

What is it?

- A Naviscat is a type of simple car rally, effectively a step up from a Treasure Hunt.
- The aim is to navigate using an Ordnance Survey map to different locations across the beautiful Kent countryside and find and answer clues which are worth points. Highest number of points WINS!!
- Organised by the South East Centre of the MG Car Club, under Motorsport UK regulations, this event is a great introduction to club motorsport in your car.
- Naviscats are not a speed-based event and take place on public roads
- There are awards for novices and for different categories of vehicle which allow a mixture of modern, classic and vintage cars to take part.
- This event will also form part of the Inter Register Club's championship.

Am I eligible to take part?

- This rally is categorised as a 'taster event' where we invite you to come and give it a go.
- All drivers must have appropriate Road Traffic Act insurance cover for the vehicle taking part. You must at all times comply with the Road Traffic Act but you may need to check with your insurer.
- No modifications are required to your vehicle to take part but the vehicle must be road legal.
- Drivers should hold a full UK driving licence and be a minimum of 18 years old.
- Navigators should be able to read a 1:50000 scale Ordnance Survey Map. NO satnavs or other electronic direction-finding devices are permitted. Minimum age for Navigators is 12 and children older than 2 may be carried in approved seats.
- Drivers and Navigators are required to hold a Motorsport UK Clubman Licence available FREE online at: <u>https://www.motorsport.org/competitors/rs-clubman-licence/</u>
- No spectators are allowed as part of the event but you are welcome to bring along passengers. There will be a point deduction for vehicles with 3 or more occupants.

N.B. All entries do need to be booked in advance and spaces are limited!! Where is it?

- The rally will start at *The Coblands Garden Centre Cafe*, A25, Sundridge, Kent TN14 6AA Hot drinks and bacon rolls etc may be purchased here.
- The finish pub is *The Little Brown Jug*, High Street, Chiddingstone Causeway, Kent TN11 8JJ This pub has an excellent reputation and we are booked in from 2.30pm.

Web & Social Media The internet is ever important with the club's activities and the move to online booking and payments. This has been a long time arriving and is still a work in progress. We first used online booking for MG100SE at the beginning of the year and that proved successful and virtually all pre-orders were made this way. With that first hurdle cleared we have put successive events online including the Ghosts at West Horsley Place, Borde Hill, the Autumn Naviscat and the Autumn Leaves Run. The latter two are booking now. It's still not perfect as there are two places that you need to enter details. That is because the club often needs more information, particularly with competitive and certificated events, to comply with the rules. This is done via a form on our website. Once that has been submitted a message shows that it was successful and then you have to press the "To Pay" button to go to the Little Box Office. This is an outside ticket agency on a separate website and you put some details in again to make the payment. This is so that we can match your payment with your entry and complies with the financial necessities.

It seems likely to remain this way for the time being. On the whole it seems to work OK other than occasional individual difficulties. There is a back up manual system if anyone does get stuck though.

South East on the Beach - Tim Morris





The run through country lanes from Knight's Garden Centre at Godstone brought many of the cars to West Horsley just in time for lunch – despite the sudden roadworks and diversion! We do seem to be plagued with roads being dug up seemingly at random this Summer.

<u>MG at Goodwood – Tim Morris</u>



The MG Moment Spectacular

Goodwood was the place to be back in July when MG had the central focus at the Festival of Speed. A huge stand, MG Moment, runs up the hill, a new concept, a design exercise and an updated SUV all featured at the event.

So, let's break it down. The new SUV first, which was an update on the best-selling HS model. This one has some major differences though not least in a larger battery and range for the PHEV model, giving it up to 75 miles on electric alone. The design has been tweaked and there is a new front end echoing the current design look as seen on the MG3 Hybrid +. It is wider and longer than the outgoing model but also 30mm lower giving a slimmer profile with a longer wheelbase making the cabin more spacious It comes in four version - a 1.5T petrol engine starts the range at £24,995 in SE spec up to the PHEV also with a 1.5T engine plus a 154Kw electric motor and 24.7kwh battery in Trophy spec at £33,995.

It looked good on the stand at Goodwood and has all the current tech you might expect from a modern car. The HS is MG's best seller at present and will no doubt continue to be so.

Joining the HS on the stand was the latest MG3 Hybrid plus, a Cyberster which reached should be reaching customers any moment, and an X-Power MG4. The other "reveal" was a surprise concept Cyber GTS coupe based on the Cyberster roadster. The design proved very popular with visitors to the stand and there is a real hope that this might be brought into production following such great customer feedback. The car on the stand was a full-scale model but there was an actual GTS running up the Hill and it certainly looked the part. Inspired by the MGC GTS seen in the opening parade the Cyber GTS spec will be similar to the current Cyberster and whilst the coupe gives more internal space it is likely to still be a two seater and it retains the internal features and two version drivetrains – plus those scissor doors.



Also on the stand was the EXE181 Hypercar. An electric speed car designed as a homage to the fastest MG ever – EX181 which set that record in 1959. Speaking to the designer, Carl Gotham, he explained that it was simply a design exercise at present but he would like to see it in action on the salt at Bonneville – if only the SAIC bigwigs sanction it!



The MG Moment was spectacular with fireworks shooting off from the top of Goodwood House as giant MG banners rose from the ground in front of the house plus a marching drum band and flag bearers – not to mention the main MG sculpture in front of the house with a Cyberster and MGB roadster high in the air piercing through a giant wire wheel.

The Cyberster, MG GTS and MG HS also made further appearances at the Salon Prive at Blenheim Palace in August and there is a video of the MG highlights on the South East YouTube channel.

Restoring a 1934 PA Airline!

Restoring a 1934 PA Airline Mad or what!

I have restored 3 MMM cars from barn finds over the years mainly because I couldn't afford a runner and relished the challenge of getting something back on the road. It was also a release from executive stress but I quickly learnt to always walk back into the house smiling whatever went wrong so the wife was happy! So, when retirement came along another project beckoned which needed completing and this was it!

Starting in Lockdown had its advantages apart from suppliers shut and the inability to get help when lifting bodies etc. But it allowed one to busy oneself without feeling too guilty.



PA 0838 Reg FA5580 started life in 1934 as a batch of 5 Airlines all of which have survived. It was the first serious batch using the 50 bodies made by Carbodies to Mr Allingham's design. FA was an all-black car, and right from the start had various issues! On file is a bonnet fire and repair (there are 72 pages of paperwork in the chassis file) and correspondence with Mr Allingham about the creaks and issues with eventually a return to Carbodies for tightening up and repairs. Although not much is known between 1936 and the 50's when owned by a Mr White it then had further incidents in the early 60's in the ownership of Phil Peckham.

Poor FA now in the MMM register as no 139 was hit up the backend by a Jag, and then later on a hit side on by a bread van which bent the passenger door in and broke a side window. (losing a catch in the process) Maybe being registered on the 13th Nov wasn't the best idea!

Still until that point it did enjoy some competition history in the hands of Phil. A full engine re-build in 1960 for £42-10-04p is on file and Phil noted 70MPH on a spirited drive. In 1963 he was even caught in a radar trap! A good performance at the South West Centre Sanctuary Trophy Rally earned first place in the pre-T type category, at the Beaulieu CC trials. It did manage to pass MOT's of the time (shame they didn't show Mileage back then) and Phil did many miles converting to Hydraulic brakes and battling dynamo leaks and charging issues as well as broken half-shafts. Eventually Phil sold it to Doug Harris in late 1967 without a current MOT for £80.00. Doug was already into MMM cars with an M type special. This had a PB blown engine and won the Mary Harris Trophy back in 1975. With his wife Margaret they did trials and auto-tests and the car is still in the family shortly to be roadworthy again.

Doug who sadly passed away in 2020 stored FA in his shed as a long-term project and as an engineer he busied himself in his spare time restoring modern MGs and in later years a beautiful 1880 saloon where they would travel on some enjoyable UK and continental rallies with the Vintage register.

Restoring a 1934 PA Airline! The poor old Airline, with some gypsies offering to take it as scrap moved house and remained untouched until Doug got round to starting the restoration in 2010. Various visitors came to see this totally slightly bent original Airline and its original interior before stripping it down to have something that would be usable on the roads. Corrosion and areas of wood needed attention and the decision was made to do a proper chassis rebuild and body restoration.

More Gongs

The Cyberster has picked up another award as the Best Sportscar at the Best Car of the Year Awards "not least because it looks like a product in the $\pm 100,000/\$100,000$ league - yet its starting price is nearer half that". These awards have now been renamed as the New Car World Championships

The MG4 has captured the Best Electric Family Car of the Year at the What Car Awards to add to its tally of over 30 different accolades and the MG5 retains Best Electric estate car. The MG3 Hybrid+ picked up the Auto-express "Best Affordable Hybrid" award, which I think might be its first gong!



When is an MG not an MG?

Visiting the Working Vehicles show at Brooklands I wasn't on the look out for any MGs and didn't expect any but then I saw the SAIC logo on the back of a truck and van. Could this be the MG T90 EV as sold in Thailand? This might be about as far from traditional MG vehicles as you can imagine and certainly attracts interesting reactions from some MG enthusiasts, but we are in a very different era of MG today.

So, the truck was badged at Brooklands as a Maxus and yes, it is an electric pick-up truck retailing at around £50k. Look closely though at the rivets surrounding all four of the wheel arches and the shiny heads are actually miniature MG logos! A strange hangover from the far east MG version but proof that it is indeed an MG!

A new "MG Windsor EV" has been launched in India. This is a crossover vehicle slightly larger than the ZS. It is already in the SAIC stable in China as the Wuling Cloud but will now also be made in India with a tie up to a company called JSW. This will fill the gap between the small hatch MG Comet and the MG ZS EV. It is priced at the equivalent of just over £9k, something unheard of for an EV in this country! It does that by eliminating the battery cost and offering it as a "battery as a service" or rental, much like Renault originally did with the Zoe.

The cost would be 3.5 rupees per km (3.2p) driven. Renault ditched the rental for their battery so I am not sure it would work in Europe to keep initial costs down. The battery is a small 38kwh pack delivering 136hp and a range of 206miles. This is the opposite of the western trend of large batteries, power and range. However, it sems unlikely that it will reach European markets although an MG2 smaller vehicle is rumoured.

State of the Nation

New car sales in general were down by 7.6% in the first half of the year and this was reflected in EV sales too. However, MG sales in Europe are looking strong and MG now have a 11% share of all EVs sold in Europe largely down to the MG4. This increase may be explained by SAIC exporting an increased number of MGs to get ahead of potential Tariff increases imposed by the EU which would mean MGs in the EU would cost 37.6% extra. At the moment the UK has not followed suit, neither has Norway, perhaps due to a fear of retaliatory tariffs which could affect what exports we have - Rolls Royce, Bentley, JLR etc. It is highly likely China will do this to EU manufacturing on BMW, Mercedes-Benz etc. However, on the bright side, SAIC are looking to invest in factories within the EU-(Hungary & Turkey (they have a trade agreement with the EU in case you were wondering) to produce MGs within the trading bloc and avoid future tariffs. The factories are likley to employ some 5k to 10k people. A similar thing is happening in Mexico where SAIC and BYD are hoping to develop large factories with an eye on the US market where the administration has put a 100% tariff on Chinese vehicles.

It appears that Europeans are still having some trouble accepting pure EVs with new sales at around 13% of the market but Hybrid EVs are doing better with 36%. There is a completely different pattern in China where some 23% of all cars are now pure electric and 19% hybrid but it is Norway that is ahead of the game with 94.7% new BEVs and just 1.3% hybrid! However, that does mean that just under 50% of all new cars in Europe are now electrified in some way. In the UK new EV sales exceeded the 22% ZEV mandate for the first time in August and grew 10% year on year.



MG ZS Upgrade and Replacement

The MG ZS is undergoing a transformation but only in its petrol versions. The ZS EV is being retired and will be replaced by a completely new SUV EV, as yet unnamed. Perhaps it's time to bring back the MG Maestro?

A new ZS Hybrid plus will be available to customers soon and is based on the same technology used in the MG3 Hybrid Plus. This will be the first time a Hybrid has been available for the MG ZS. A 1.5litre petrol engine feeds a 45kw generator charging a 1.84Kwh battery ultimately producing 196hp and around 55mpg. Prices start at under £22,000.

The choice of new MGs is expanding rapidly - there are now 11 different models of new MG available for purchase. Eight are electrified in some form and most come in two different specs – SE or Trophy. It is certainly a long way from those early days when the re-vamped NAC/SAIC MGTF first appeared.

The opportunity to buy a new MG at the moment, as MG clear the decks for new or updated models, is fantastic with up to ± 10 k being knocked off the RRP of some models. An ideal time to buy.

MGF and TF New Book This new book is written by the South East Chairman Tim Morris and chronicles the development of the MGF and TF but it puts that story in perspective of MG history and racing/speed records. The story begins with Cecil Kimber and finishes with the TF being produced by SAIC. It is a long road and the first two chapters cover that early development succinctly before we get on to the heart of the book – the MGF. From those early inspirations and prototype days the book charts the development and production of both the F and TF against the background of industrial difficulties as ownership of the company moved from British Aerospace to BMW and on to MG Rover and NAC/SAIC. Given all that it was incredible that the UK's best-selling roadster emerged at all and survived as long as it did.

This handy book is ideal for those coming to the MGF/TF for the first time, wanting to know a bit more about them, wanting a concise history of MG or even looking to buy an F/TF as there is a handy "Best of" Buyers Guide at the back.

It is illustrated with over 100 photos, mostly from the author's own collection, including some from local South East events including Brooklands – and they are not just MGFs and TFs either!



MGF AND TF

Launched in 1995, the MGF marked the rebirth of the dassic British MG two-seater sports car. In this back, MFG expert Tim Morris tells the full inside story of the development of the MGF and TF against the background of the seismic changes that were taking place in the British car industry. After the demise of the bestselling MGB and the closure of the Abingdon factory in 1980, It seemed as if the closic MG sports car had come to an end. An upgraded version of the MGB, the RVB, was introduced in the 1990s, but meanwhile designers and engineers were busy with an all-new car, which was unveiled in 1995. Developed under British Aerospace and launched under 8MW ownership of the Rover Group, the MGF cane under MG-Rover ownership after 8MW divided the company in 2000. At this time the TF was developed and produced until the campany went into administration in 2005. Here design factures such as the mid-angine format and Hydrages suspension system are described, as well as the various model changes and re-design and how the car fared against strong competition from cars such as the Max26 MX5. Including information for owners and potential buyers and with a wide selection of flustration, this is an essential goide to the MGF and TF sports cars.


